Robert "Bob" L. McCoy (45), Las Vegas, NV, died May 21, 2013. Bob was born in Dunbarton, the 10th of 13 children, to a farming couple, Charles and Frances McCoy. He was the second of the family's two sons. Bob attended country schools along with

his brother and eleven sisters. His first commercial enterprise as a youngster was growing and selling a half acre of popcorn. He married Mary Gile, the fourth of ten children, in 1945. They lived in Shullsburg and raised a family that grew to include five children.

Bob started out farming, but within a couple years tried his hand at cheese-making at the Brewery Hill Cheese Factory along with collecting milk in 10 gallon cans from area farmers using the factory's truck. Trucking clicked with Bob and by 1947 he had moved on to longhaul trucking between Dubuque, IA, New York and Chicago.

The need to raise investment capital eventually led to the formation of the Mc-Mor-Han Trucking Company in 1954, a partnership between Bill Morrissey (46), who owned and operated his own dump-truck business, Ray Hanna (Bob's brother-in-law), and Bob. The business expanded in 1958 when they were awarded a GMC truck dealership selling light and medium duty trucks. In 1966 a new facility was built on Hwy 11 and heavy duty truck sales were added. The dealership later became Truck Country and currently operate from a dozen locations.

The small company started in Shullsburg has grown to become the McCoy Group Inc, a holding company with six subsidiaries: Truck Country, Tow Truck Country, McCoy NationaLease, Foodliner, Quest Liner and Quest Logistics.

Bob was a member of the Shullsburg School Board for 15 years, serving most of those as board president. He was on the GMC National Dealer Council from 1962 to 1966. In 1976 he was awarded the Lafayette County Community Promotion Businessman of the Year. He was elected mayor of Shullsburg in 1980 for a 2-year term. He was a member of the Amicitia Lodge #25 Free and Accepted Masons of Shullsburg and became a 32nd Degree Mason.

As his sons and later, grandsons, became active in the McCoy Group enterprises, Bob started investing in local farmland. His latest project was writing a fascinating and insightful book of the history of his life and the McCoy Group, which was completed and published in 2012.

His wife, Mary, his children Nancy Donnell (64), Jack (63), Mike (66), Bob, Jr. (70), and Denise Shane (73) survive him. He is also survived by 17 grandchildren, 24 great-grandchildren, and five sisters, Marjorie Criddle (38), Doris Schumacher (42), Mary Staben (36), Joan Wiersma.

Robert "Bob" Ubersox, Shullsburg, died May 18, 2013 at Lafayette Manor. Bob attended high school with the Class of 1951. He married Brigid Cavanaugh on November 11, 1950. Together they farmed in the Shullsburg and Gratiot areas for many years. In later years Bob worked for FS in Shullsburg, and mowed yards.

Bob enjoyed music, dancing, hunting and fishing with his family. He also enjoyed attending their sporting events and extracurricular activities. He was a fan of the Packers, the Badgers, and Dolly Parton.

His wife Brigid, nine children: George (Butch), Andrew, Daniel, Vickie Groom, Bonnie Kieler, Sally Montgomery, Margie, Kristy Allen, 34 grandchildren, 26 great-grandchildren, 3 brothers: John "Hans" Ubersox, Chuck Ubersox, and George "Butch" Ubersox, and one sister: Ann Herman, survive him.

Robert "Rolo" Trevethan (71), Ballston Spa, NY, died July 4, 2013. He was born in Tacoma, WA, the son of Roland and Gladys Trevethan. He grew up on a small farm south of Shullsburg and was active in sports while in high school. Rob enjoyed camping, music, the Chicago Bears, and a good joke.

He is survived by his children Chelsea Beyer and Robbie Trevethan, his mother Gladys Perkins, his sister Cathy Engels, and special friend, Kathy Holden.
