The Bradleys have several goals they'll be working toward. They have formed a volunteer group, the Shullsburg Ambassadors, to help with the many endeavors they have planned.

One of these endeavors is the Shullsburg Pioneer Database. Using Federal Census Records, pioneers living in Shullsburg beginning in 1850 will be added to a database including pictures and stories provided by <u>you</u>, the family and friends of these important pioneers. <u>Your</u> contributions will greatly enhance the substance of available information. This database will be available for public viewing on the Badger Mine and Museum web page when it is finished. The database is being created in cooperation with Southwest Technical School in Fennimore, WI. On the 4th of July the Badger Mine & Museum offered 2 special guided tours that included Gravity Hill, the Berry Tavern, Gratiot's Grove and other historical sites and stories about Shullsburg. It ended with cheese tasting downtown at Crooked Canvas. The cheese was generously donated by Shullsburg Creamery. "Jesse Shull" and his family were in the 4th of July parade and were also at the Mine & Museum after the parade to have their picture taken with interested patrons.

Future plans in the works are Shullsburg history classes and activities that may be offered at school and at the mine and museum, historical tours around Shullsburg, Pioneer Days at the Mine & Museum, and summer programs for kids involving historical experiences.


