Changes in the Old Burg

City Named Main Street Community

Shullsburg is the latest city in Wisconsin to be designated as a "Main Street Community". State Senator Howard Marklein and Representative Todd Novak came to Shullsburg for the announcement in August 2016.

Shullsburg is the 34th city and the 2nd smallest city to receive this distinction since the program's inception in 1987. The program was developed by the Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation (WEDC) to help revitalize traditional business districts and promote historic and economic redevelopment. It gives the downtown area access to grants and resources that the city on its own could not afford or have access to.

This designation was received due to efforts by **Advance Shullsburg**, a two-year old organization that focuses on economic development. Its 21-person board is made up of citizens from Shullsburg and the surrounding area, along with 4 sub- committees that focuses on specific goals.

These goals were based on a community needs report submitted by the Wisconsin Main Street Program in December. A team of professionals spent four days in Shullsburg interviewing citizens and observing the town to create the report. The group's President, Cory Ritterbusch, is also a City Councilman. **Advance Shullsburg** has also conducted the research for a new housing subdivision to go in on the south end of town, hopefully this year.


