Changes in the Old Burg Shullsburg History Comes To Life Through Recent Gift

When Glenn Matl (44) passed away in June 2017 members of his family, William and Donna Sefton, donated items to the Badger Mine & Museum that had been saved and passed down in Glenn's family for many years. Among these are letters and drawings by Isaac Glines, Glenn's great-grandfather.



Isaac Glines (pictured left) came to Shullsburg at age 16, along with his family from Marietta, Ohio in 1836, just 9 years after Shullsburg was established. With only an 8th grade education he wrote letters to family members vividly describing the difficult journey they made through the frontier.

He later wrote for two local newspapers, the *South Western Local* and the *Pick and Gad*, describing life in Shullsburg and the local lead mines in detail.

Two of his drawings are now being restored and conserved at the Wisconsin Historical Society. One drawing gives a bird's eye view of 1836 Shullsburg showing the cabins and homes with White Oak Hill and Gratiot's Grove in the background. The second drawing illustrates the smelting operation at Gratiot's Grove from about 1845 showing the men working in the smelter.

Drawn in an age before photography by an untrained artist, these drawings are the only depictions of early days of the southwestern territories known to exist. Because of their rarity and historical significance their value is estimated to be \$30,000 to \$70,000 each. You can see framed copies of the two drawings on display now at the Badger Mine & Museum during their season which ends after Labor Day weekend.

Parkview Development Gets Final Approval – Ground Broken

Installation of city utilities are underway in Shullsburg's Parkview Subdivision after several years of planning and debate. The proposed residential subdivision lies on the south side of Shullsburg, just east of County Road O. The land for the subdivision was gifted to the city by the John R. McCoy and Susan B. McCoy Family Foundation, a non-profit entity. Up to 25 lots are planned for development. House lots will be sold to qualified buyers for \$1 each once infrastructure is completed, possibly by June 1, 2019. Perfect location for your dream home!
