Local Service Group Disbands

After 25 years of volunteer service to the community, the **Miner Community Group** has disbanded due to dwindling numbers and the aging of its membership. The group was formed in 1994 when the Shullsburg Jaycees disbanded. Their goal was to continue support for local projects started by the Jaycees, both financially and with their time and labor, too.

Since 2011 the group has given over \$12,000 to local organizations and fundraisers, such as the Shullsburg post prom, Bicentennial Celebration, food pantry, EMS, senior center, and the Emily Franz Scholarship Fund. They also ran the annual Easter Egg Hunt, Christmas Blessings project and Halloween Haunted house. All their funds were earned by the group's concessions and kids games during Shullsburg's annual 4th of July Celebration.

2019 will be their final year to participate in the 4th of July Celebration. In another act of generosity, the group recently donated a total of \$3000 to five worthy causes in

the community: the food pantry, Hodan Center, Shullsburg EMS, Shullsburg Home and the Shullsburg Senior Center. Francis R. "Tish" Tuescher (50), Darlington, WI passed away February 24, 2019 at Lafayette Manor in Darlington. He was born on September 18, 1832 in Truman, WI the son of Florence (McKeon) and Rudolph Tuescher. Tish was raised by his grandparents Marie and Rudolph

Tuescher and his aunt Fidelus Burke and her husband Joseph. He attended Center Hill School and Holland Rural School before enrolling in Shullsburg.

He enlisted in the United States Air Force after graduating and trained as a mechanic in aircraft and jet engines. Tish served for 4 years, 3 of those in Germany. He was honorably discharged in 1954 and returned to Lafayette County. He married Patricia J. Johnson in 1955 at Holy Rosary Catholic Church in Darlington. He re-enlisted in the Air Force in 1955. During the next 16 years they were stationed in Arizona, Missouri, Canada, Texas, South Carolina, Korea and Thailand. Tish was then drafted into instructor duty for 4 years until retiring in 1972 after serving 20 years. 
