Advance Shullsburg, a local nonprofit economic development group, has finished several projects lately. In January they opened the Shullsburg Visitors Center at 204 W. Water Street. There you will find a self-guided tour of Shullsburg's unique character along with videos about Shullsburg and tourism information. The Center is staffed by volunteers Friday-Sunday from 10-4 p.m.



July an impressive new "Welcome Shullsburg" sign was built on the edge of West town on Highway 11. It stands boldly displaying Experience the

Shullsburg logo (the group's tourism campaign). There will be an identical sign built on the east edge of town in September.

Zelda (Trebilcock) Bruun, Platteville, WI, died December 18, 2018 at Park Place Assisted Living, Platteville. She was born in Shullsburg on December 18, 1922, the daughter of Chester and Jane Elizabeth (Laird) Trebilcock. She attended SHS

with the Class of 1942. Zelda married Lester Bruun in 1941 in Dubuque, IA. They farmed together for many years in the Shullsburg area before moving to a farm near Belmont.

She was active in the Methodist Church in Shullsburg and later in Belmont. Zelda was a member of the Order of the Eastern Star for 70 years. 
