Changes in the Old Burg

Wheel In Closes After 40+ Years

It certainly is the end of an era! The Wheel In with its restaurant, bar, and banquet facilities served their last customers on February 23 and the equipment was sold at an auction held February 29, 2020. The owners have sold the business to Dollar General. It is unknown exactly what the new owners will do with it but time will tell.

This truck stop/restaurant and banquet facility was built by the Don Freymiller family in the 1970's. At the time the Freymillers had a large interstate trucking company based here in Shullsburg and saw a need for more services for traffic on Highway 11. After running the business for a short time, they sold the facility to concentrate on the trucking business. New owners tweaked the operation and soon the Wheel In was a local grub hub open 7 days a week with wedding receptions, dances, and celebrations of all sorts held in the banquet hall at the back. Many of us have eaten hundreds of meals and attended dozens of events there over the years! For a long while the Wheel In was the only large reception hall in our local area. That was the heyday of the facility when the joint was jumping almost every weekend. Time passed and competition sprung up all around it. The building aged and lost business to the new, shiny and trendy establishments people grew to like. With respect, the Wheel In stayed true to itself. The menu remained standard American food, usually done well and served up fast and hot, in a downhome, casual, friendly atmosphere.

Thank you to the owners and the many, many employees of the Wheel In who worked to prepare and serve food and drink to whoever walked in the door. Shullsburg has been lucky to have had you for so long! The Alumni Association will miss you! Thanks for the memories!
