Anna (Chandler 12) Reichling is continuing her legacy of soap making, with Ellen's Soap Pantry. Her mother, Ellen Doyle(72), began making soap in 1990, using a cherished recipe passed down from her great grandmother Anna and given to her from Pauline (Doyle (32)) Dickinson. What started as a simple endeavor to provide handmade soap for her family quickly expanded to include friends, and eventually blossomed into a full-fledged business once she realized the widespread interest in her products.

When Ellen and her family moved to Shullsburg, she brought the business with her, finding a warm welcome in the local community. "I was very fortunate to receive so much support from the community," Ellen reflects, "and I loved being part of the shops downtown." Her handcrafted soaps became a beloved staple in the area, known for their quality and the care that went into each batch.

As the years went by, Ellen decided to slow down with the business, but she continued to make her soaps available at the Cheese Store, as well as to family and friends. Her presence in the community remained strong, and her soaps continued to be a local favorite. In early 2024, Ellen's soap-making business entered a new chapter with Anna, taking over. "I am so excited to be keeping the business going and ready to see where it goes," Anna shared. With a passion for continuing her mother's legacy, Anna has expanded the availability of Ellen's Soap Pantry products. The current products are soap, lip balm and sugar scrubs. The library has undergone a transformation, offering the community thousands of new books, four new laptops, a modern help desk, a convenient drop box, a new conference room, and an Adult Maker Space equipped with tools like a Cricut Heat Press, a button maker, and more.

The Grand Opening event was a day of celebration, drawing in visitors with tours of the renovated space, fun trivia challenges, giveaways, and a raffle. Guests also enjoyed snacks and drinks as they explored the library's new offerings.

The McCoy Public Library has long been a cherished institution in the community, and this renovation was made possible with generous support from local residents and organizations.
